A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Since we have heard that some persons have gone out from us and troubled you with words, unsettling your minds, although we gave them no instructions, it has seemed good to us, having come to one accord, to choose men and send them to you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, men who have risked their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We have therefore sent Judas and Silas, who themselves will tell you the same things by word of mouth. For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to lay on you no greater burden than these requirements: that you abstain from what has been sacrificed to idols, and from blood, and from what has been strangled, and from sexual immorality. If you keep yourselves from these, you will do well. Farewell.'

THE REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

It is difficult to build on success, there can always be opposition even among those who are supposed to agree with you .The disciples had to deal with the issue of, if they were followers of the law God gave to Moses, as Jesus was, all believers should share Jesus's practice including the traditions. But for the new Christians that Peter, Paul, and all the apostles were introducing to Christianity, Christianity was the answer for all nations who lived in hope of a better world..

The council of Jerusalem, perhaps only 15 to 20 years after Jesus's death, of apostles and Christians who wanted to keep the practice of the law reached a consensus that the High family values of fidelity and respect for the complementary sex should stay but the practice of the law should not be forced on the gentiles who do not have the traditions dating back to Moses. Meals for the community together should avoid only having anything which might have blood in it, to include the Loyally Jewish Christians. In short Moussaka, fish pie and vegetarian quiche should be available.

Guided perhaps by the Pharisee Gamaliel, said to the Jewish Sanhedrin that if the Apostles way was God's will it would flourish, if it was not from God it would decline.

Jesus knew he was going to say goodbye to his apostles here on earth, but his message of the Spirit being with them reveals the unity of the Trinity, because the Spirit would continue to guide the Church in its future

Christianity is focussed on the Son of God who became the son of man. His message is for us and made real in himself. The Holy Spirit will be sent to the disciples to guide them and

the people of God. The peace Jesus wanted was to be among his people, a sign to the world. Others have tried to hijack the Christian teaching and claim another source for it without Christ because it was so good and successful. The New city of God will have Jewish names on the doors, perhaps in tribute to the original apostles but it will be open to all who believe in the name of Christ.
