THE REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

The simplest model of the Trinity is the Father giving to the Son and the Son and Spirit returning everything to the Father. Outside of space and time this is a loving relationship of giving, receiving and returning.

The idea of love as giving to another comes from the Trinity, Pope John Paul wrote of marriage as an opportunity for the closest intimacy, mirroring the Trinity in self-giving love.

The human love we know is a gift from God, enriching our consciousness of our selves. Different from all other life this is about our relationships. We can only really fulfil ourselves by giving ourselves, opening up to new opportunities to a full and rich life.

At the End of the Easter time, we can begin to understand God's final plan for us becomes clearer: the reaching out to us by becoming incarnate, a real body, communicating with us and showing the greatest love by giving his life for us, he calls his friends. This led to the resurrection, the reality of a transformed and fully healed life.

Our prayers are based on a sense of gratitude to God, thanking God for the gifts of life and love. In the quiet between Good Friday and Easter Sunday an early writer interpreted Jesus' action descending into the underworld to say

"I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of my hands, you who were created in my image.... I will not restore you to that paradise, but I will enthrone you in heaven. I forbade you the tree that was only a symbol of life, but see, I who am life itself am now one with you. .. The kingdom of heaven has been prepared for you from all eternity.
